# **November Lockdown - Important Information**

As you are acutely aware we have now entered a second national lockdown. The impact on schools has been less so than on your work lives I am sure. We are so pleased to continue to welcome the children to school every day, with heightened cleaning protocols on equipment and for the children. We are still working in separate bubbles and spend most of our time in class bubbles, following strict protocols to work facing forward and at a distance where possible, in classes 2,3 and 4. EYFS children are still able to work in small groups for small amounts of time. We are enjoying some lessons outdoors, and have remained focused on the National Curriculum, whilst fully centring on the children's wellbeing we are all enjoying a wonderfully rich and varied curriculum, which I am hoping you hear about. We are thrilled to have new Interactive whiteboard screens in every classroom to enhance learning and make life in the classroom that bit more vivid and our topics have certainly come to life! Whilst all remains safe and secure inside school, we are very aware of the impact of the lockdown outside of school. Can I reiterate a number of points, for the safety of all in our school community:

- Drop off and pick up time must be adhered to, and can we encourage a 'speedy' exit from around the school site.
- Children and families must not mix outside of the school site, in line with guidance.
- Face coverings to be worn, at drop off and pick up times.
- Families, in line with new lockdown rules, must not congregate, unless you are meeting a single person or meeting a support bubble.
- If your child has symptoms of Covid-19, please arrange for a test and self-isolate for 14 days.
- If your child receives a positive test, please inform the school immediately by 'phone Monday Friday or email between Friday evening Monday morning. Please use <a href="https://www.headteacher@stathern.leics.sch.uk">headteacher@stathern.leics.sch.uk</a>
- Children do not need to wear face coverings.
- ✤ All visits and visitors to school should be restricted.
- Clinically extremely vulnerable staff and children are not to attend school, upon advice from their GP.
- Clinically vulnerable staff and children may continue to attend school.
- Before and After school club can remain open.
- Music, dance and drama can still be undertaken.
- PE lessons can continue as part of the weekly curriculum.
