

THE SCHOOL IS DEVELOPING A CURRICULUM THAT INSPIRES ALL CHILDREN TO CHANGE THE WORLD FOR THE BETTER.



Knowledge is skilfully shared to engage all children in projects that 'make a difference' to the local community and the world beyond by considering:

A) Learning from the experience of others – including Geography, History, Science

B) Creative/Fantasy – Using the power of the imagination

C) Designing and making products that could improve the world including Enterprise

D) Understanding and Improving local and global lssues

All children embed knowledge in their long term memory and develop skills alongside a clear understanding of purpose and context, linking their learning to the world they are living in. Children are always encouraged children to ask 'why' we learn about the things. There is a great emphasis on high level vocabulary and the ability to articulate their learning and emotions. As a small and non-diverse village school, our curriculum is also designed to enable pupils to: grow in their global understanding of different cultures, to challenge stereotypes and to appreciate diversity.
