Dear parents, carers, pupils and members of the community, welcome to our Summer Term newsletter.

Happy Bank Holiday Weekend!

We are so very lucky to be looking forward to further relaxations of the restrictions placed on society and we cannot thank you enough for doing this sensitively and cautiously. With your help outside of school, at school we still follow guidance that means we have had very few suspected cases, and no confirmed cases of COVID...I do look forward to a newsletter soon with no mention of this...but it's exciting to think we have had no bubble closures, and apart for a few sore throats and colds, all are well and attendance is at 96%, which is just above the national average.

The Summer term isn't quite as obviously full of visits and sporting events as it has been in previous years, although many events still happen in school with virtual inter school competitions and days out in our wonderful local area. Plans are however, starting to begin for these activities in the coming academic year.

Our focus on our nurture curriculum is supporting children, and the staff are working hard to make the learning fun whilst ensuring good progress is made whilst considering the strangeness of the World. We are prioritising the learning curriculum to focus on skills, as previously mentioned, ensuring at this stage of the year that the children are ready for their next steps in learning. We are hoping to make some changes to our curriculum and organisation, to support all children who have faced at least 6 months out of school in the last 12 months, some even more with isolation and bubble closures earlier in the year. The focus on phonics, reading and early maths skills is of paramount importance to us, and through all years the focus on these basic skills is equally important.

This term, we begin to think about welcoming new children into the Stathern School Family, and saying goodbye to our Year 6 children. I have written to both new parents and Year 6 parents as we being to consider the events of the summer term. We are awaiting the June 21st date as a turning point for the nation and will keep you posted as to any changes that will affect you and the protocols at school.

There is much to be excited about, including the improvement of our website, and I will shortly be sending out Summer Term parent surveys and a website survey, to enable you to tell us what you would like to see! I very much welcome your thoughts and opinions.

Governors Corner

It has been wonderful to see the children return to school and watch the careful planning by the staff come to fruition with the children adapting and settling back in so quickly. It is starting to feel very positive as the weather warms up and the restrictions slowly ease and, from a governor's perspective, for us to be able to focus on longer term support of the school in our work as opposed to crisis management. Although special educational needs and safeguarding visits have continued virtually throughout the pandemic, we are starting to return to our more usual activity to support the school in terms of visits around subjects and curriculum and to look to the future and how we can work to support the staff to ensure that each pupil is supported and afforded the opportunities to read their full potential, despite the disruptions that have been a necessary response to the pandemic. The governors are working to support the staff to minimise the impact of the interruptions and provide a safe, secure and steady environment for the children. We have also started looking at the impact on the school of the increased housing due to be built in the village; the priority being to maintain and improve the quality of the experience of pupils in the school. It has been a difficult period but the school values of nurture, inspire, discover and create have been evident in the way the school, staff and pupils have responded in such a positive way and we look forward to an increasing return to 'normality' as we progress through the remainder of the summer term.


School Uniform
